Rules

1. You use **some** and **any** with uncountable nouns or the plural forms of countable nouns.
2. **Some** is used in positive statements, polite requests or offers.
3. You use **any** in negative sentences and (real) questions.
4. A mentioned noun can be left out - if it was mentioned shortly before
→ Do you have **any** chocolate? - No, I don't have **any** (=any chocolate)!

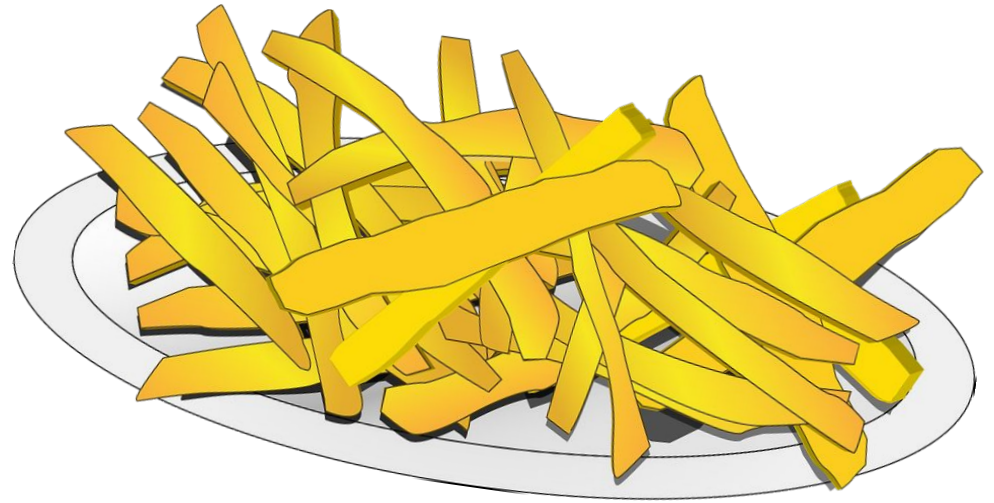


Positive Statements

Jan can use **some** cake mix for his birthday cake.



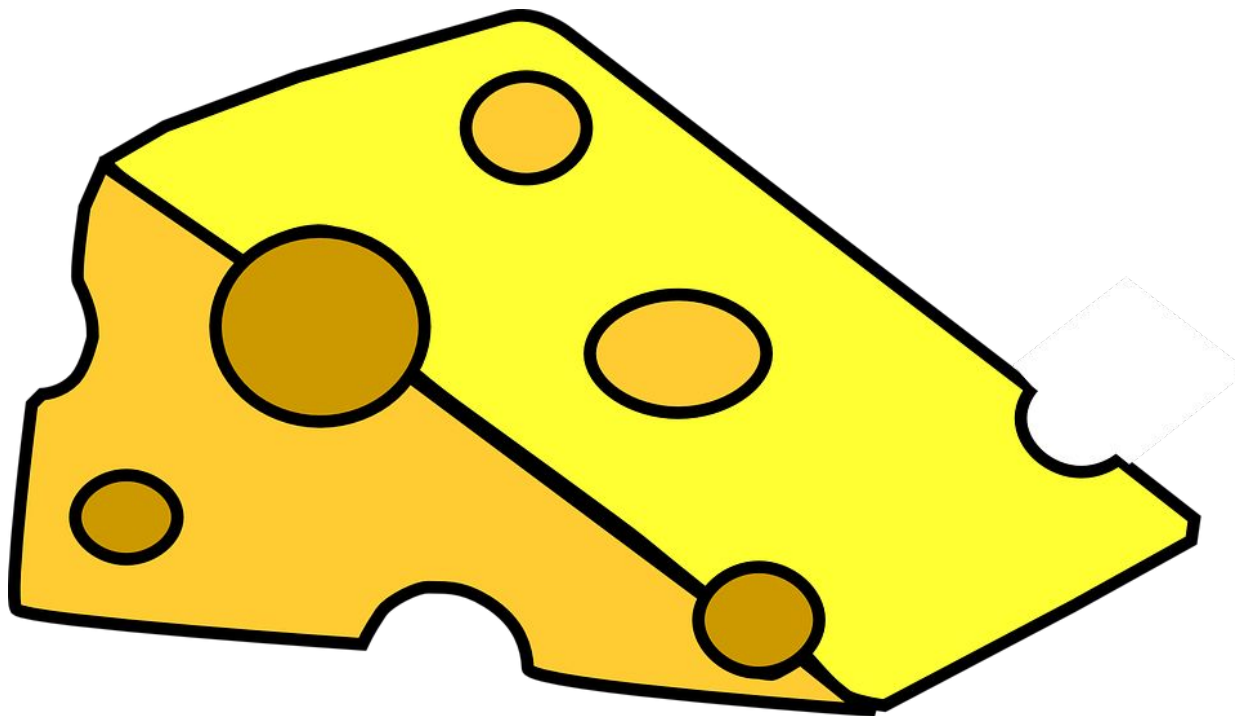
Seher had **some** chips on her plate



Polite Requests and Offers

Could you get me some cheese?

Would you like some ketchup to your chips?

Negative Sentences



No

Example: → *There isn't **any** cheese in the fridge*

→ *I never eat **any** vegetables*

*Example: → Have we got **any** potatoes?*

*→ Are there **any** onions in the food?*
